


Challenges and Successes

- The UN adopted more than 20 principal treaties in addition to the International Bill of Human Rights
- Regional documents for the protection and promotion of human rights extend International Bill of Rights 1990 The Cairo Declaration on Human Rights in Islam 1981 Charter of Human and People's Rights (Africa)
- All states have ratified at least one, and 80% of States treaties have ratified four or more, of the core human rights

Case study: Bangladesh

- Ratified seven of the eight core ILO labour Conventions
- Limited freedom of association the right to collective bargaining, right to strike
- Discrimination against women
- Child labour
